Sea Turtle Savers

Turtles 101: Campers will learn about the differences between land, river and sea turtles as well as take a behind-the-scenes tour of our sea turtle hospital and outdoor rehabilitation area.

Jr. Veterinarians: Campers will learn about the “rescue to release” protocol of our state-of-the-art sea turtle hospital and take a tour behind-the-scenes! Dr. Logger will make a special appearance to discuss threats to sea turtles and how sea turtle savers can help.

Field Trip — Juno Beach Pier: campers will learn how to be conscious and responsible anglers by pairing up with the Juno Beach locals and learning proper techniques of catch and release fishing. After learning their new skills, they will test them at Juno Beach Pier

Debris-Free Seas: Campers will explore the sea turtle yard to observe the injuries sea turtles can sustain in a polluted ocean. Then, they will put their engineering skills to test and construct solutions to the pollution.

Habitats/Nesting: Campers will learn about critical habitats for both terrestrial and marine turtles as well as the nesting process of sea turtles and the fight for survival for sea turtle hatchlings.

PARENT REMINDERS

Drop-off

Sign-in starts at 8:30 am on our back deck. Please park in Loggerhead Park behind the center and enter through **back gate**. Do not park in the staff lot or in front of the center. For safety reasons, **YOU MUST SIGN YOUR CAMPER/S IN & OUT EACH DAY**. Parents must sign in/out campers, even if the camper is old enough to drive themselves.

Lunch, Snacks & Water
